1. Why does God punish sin? (*He is holy and just.*)
2. What did God do to punish the sinful people on Earth? (*He destroyed the people and the animals in a great flood.*)
3. How do you know God loves you? (*He created me. His Word says so.*)
4. What did God tell Noah to do so he and his family would not die in the flood? (*Build an ark.*)
5. What did people think when Noah told them God was going to send a great flood? (*They didn't believe him; they must have thought he was crazy.*)
6. What is the one way you can be saved from the punishment of your sins? (*By believing on Jesus.*)
7. Who shut the door of the ark? (*God.*)
8. How do we know that God will never send a great flood to destroy the Earth again? (*He promised He wouldn't; He put a rainbow in the sky to remind us of His promise.*)
9. Name one way the Holy Spirit helps you obey God. (*Shows me things in my life that need to change; helps me make right choices; reminds me what the Bible says.*)
10. Our memory verse, Ephesians 2:8-9, tells us we are saved by God's _____ through _____. (*Grace; faith.*)
11. What is grace? (*When God gives us something we don't deserve.*)
12. What is one way God has shown grace to you? (*Made a way for me to be saved from the punishment of my sins; answers may vary.*)

1. What is God's punishment for sin? (*Having to be away from God.*)
2. What is sin? (*Breaking God's rules.*)
3. Who never sins? (*God; Jesus.*)
4. Who did God tell to build the ark? (*Noah.*)
5. Who went in the ark with Noah? (*His family and animals.*)
6. Noah listened to God and obeyed. What does God want you to do? (*Listen and obey.*)
7. What does a rainbow remind us of? (*God's promise to never again destroy the Earth with a flood.*)
8. According to the memory verse, how did God show you His love? (*He sent Jesus to die on the cross.*)
9. What did Jesus do for you and me? (*Died on the cross.*)
10. How can you be saved from the punishment of sin? (*Believe in Jesus as the only one who can save me from sin.*)

Review Game

"Act Like Animals"

Materials:

"Act Like Animals" cards

(See Resource and PowerPoint CD.)

Instructions:

When a child answers a question, award his team 1,000 points and allow him to choose a card that has a kind of animal written on the back of it (or simply whisper an animal name in the child's ear.) He has to do charades to help his team guess which animal he is. Be prepared to quietly give suggestions on how to act out each animal. (Challenge older children to do it without making any noise.) Award an extra 1,000 points when the animal is guessed correctly.

Animals that would be rather easy to act out include: rabbits, dinosaurs, elephants, kangaroos, snakes, dogs, penguins, cats, monkeys, deer (with antlers), pigs, roosters.

Variation:

For a larger group, involve more children by having the child choose a teacher to cover his ears and close his eyes while the child tells his team which animal they will be acting out. Have the whole team act out the animal while the teacher tries to guess which animal it is. If the teacher guesses the correct animal, the child's team wins double points!

Preschool Review Game

"Noah's Animals"

When a child answers a question, he can choose an animal for all the children to imitate—either with actions, sounds or both. The teacher may need to give some suggestions such as:

Hop like a rabbit.
Flap your arms like a bird.
Climb a tree like a monkey.
Meow like a cat.
