“Using God’s Word to Pray”

INTRODUCTION

“I was so scared! I didn’t know what to do. Last night there was a huge storm by my house. I was so afraid. I wanted to pray to God but I didn’t know what to say.

Then I remembered a verse I learned in the Bible.” (Read Psalm 56:3.)

Sometimes you might not know what to say to God but His Word can help you know what to pray.

USING GOD’S WORD TO PRAY

There is a whole book in the Bible called the Psalms. It is full of songs and prayers that God’s people wrote to talk to Him. If you have trusted Jesus as your Savior, **God the Holy Spirit lives in you to help you listen to and obey His Word.** When you read the Bible, you can pray the words you read back to God. Let’s try this together.

PRAYER

(Choose one or more of the following verses: Psalm 56:3; Psalm 66:4; Psalm 75:1; Psalm 86:5; Psalm 100:3; Psalm 121:2; Proverbs 3:5; Ephesians 4:32; 2 Peter 3:18; Deuteronomy 31:6; Proverbs 3:24; Colossians 3:12. Read the verse then have another teacher say it as a prayer. Below is an example.)

READ: “What time I am afraid, I will trust in Thee.” (Psalm 56:3)

PRAY: “Dear God, I am afraid right now. I trust You to keep me safe.”

Preschool Welcome Activity “The Listening Game”
